

Mr. Justice Henry S. Brown – Biography

Mr. Justice Henry S. Brown Appointed judge of the Federal Court and *ex officio* member of the Federal Court of Appeal on June 13, 2014, and Judge of the Court Martial Appeal Court on May 28, 2015. Mr. Justice Brown received his BA (Hons. Canadian History, 1973) and MA (Canadian Studies, 1976) from Carleton University, and his Bachelor of Laws from the University of Ottawa (1979 - Silver Medalist) and was called to the Bar of Ontario in 1981. He was appointed Queen's Counsel (Canada) in 1991. Mr. Justice Brown was with the Ottawa office of Gowling & Henderson, later known as Gowlings, for over 35 years before his appointment to the Federal Court. He had a large agency and counsel practice in the Supreme Court of Canada involving more than 1500 appeals and applications for leave in connection with which he appeared more than 70 times, excluding chambers motions. Justice Brown was the author of *Supreme Court of Canada Practice* (Carswell / Thomson Reuters), and contributed over 140 articles and reports to *The Supreme Court Law Review* and the *Criminal Law Quarterly*. He has heard cases in a number of areas including immigration, citizenship, security and safety, patent, access to information, human rights, trademark, grievance, and judicial review / appeals of Federal government decision-makers.
